Engagement

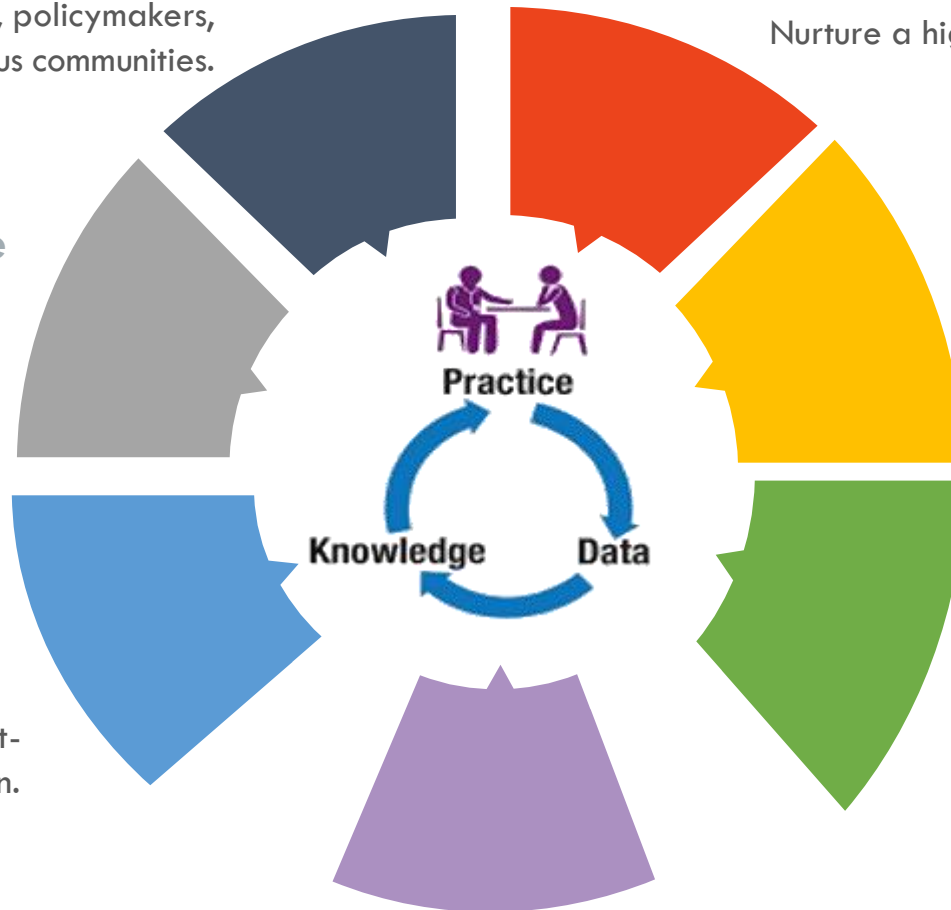
Create and nurture sustained partnerships with diverse partners.

Access to Care Pillar



- Advanced access.
- Virtual Care.

Integration of Care Pillar



- Case management.
- CKD management & prevention in primary care.
- Addressing SDOHs in primary care.
- Building infrastructure using data in primary care research.

Primary Care Information System Focus



- Survey for patient-reported experience & outcome measures (OECD PaRIS & CPIN).
- Decrease inappropriate antibiotic use.

Indigenous Health Pillar



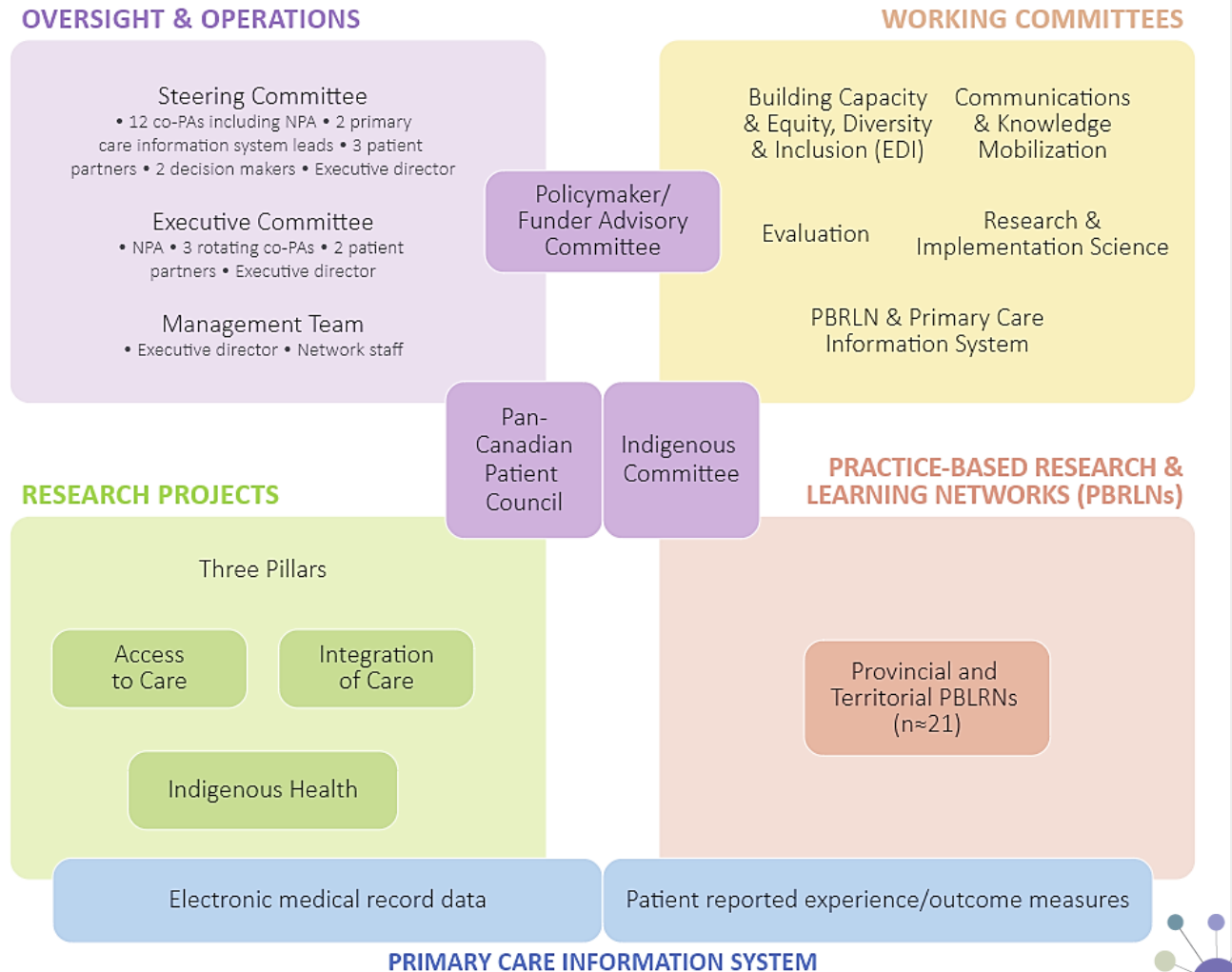
- Still in development.



CPCRN IMPLEMENTATION

Benefits

- Online community of practice with different channels to meet network needs (PCRN Connect)
- PHC information system made up of EMR data linked to PREMs/PROMs linked to provincial administrative data
- Access to FPT primary care counterparts
 - *this is currently non-existent in Canada.
- Access to PBLRNs, community members, and Indigenous groups across Canada



FINANCIAL INVESTMENTS: \$10 MM

8 Research Projects Funded at \$75,000 each per year for four years

CPCSSN Receiving \$300,000 per year over five years
EMR data set for research

CPIN Receiving \$48,000 per year over five years
PREM/PROM data set for research

**11 provinces/territories for
PBRLNs**

Funded at \$50,000 per year over five years

Distributed Support Model

Executive Director & Sr. Administrative Coordinator salaries
Four 0.5 FTE positions funded for Engagement, Comms & KTE,
Research & PCIS work (\$40,625 each for five years)

Patient Partner Compensation

Budgeted at \$63,000 per year

KTE Initiatives

\$200,000 total

Building Capacity

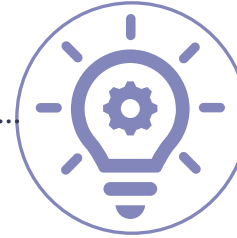
\$50,000 per year for TUTOR-PHC program
